Instructions:

- Your talk will be assigned to a session between 10am and 12.30pm on one of Monday 12, Thursday 15 and Friday 16 October. We will assign you randomly to one of these sessions. If, for exceptional circumstances, you are unable to attend one of these sessions, please alert us by **Friday 25 September** with as much detail as you are comfortable sharing and we will do our best to schedule you accordingly.

By Friday 2 October:

- The program will be available on this webpage on **Friday 2 October**. Please check the program carefully as to which session you are scheduled to present in.

By Wednesday 7 October 5pm:

- Prepare your talk according to the instructions below and submit the PowerPoint file by **Wednesday 7 October 5pm** PRIOR to the Young Investigator Symposium using this form: <https://forms.gle/cbCe5k5WEVBMJ43y7>

Preparing your talk:

- Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title.
- 8mins presentation + 2mins questions.
- PowerPoint – slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing on the Zoom platform.
- Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.

On the day:

- Your presentation will be made via Zoom Webinar. A link to the Zoom session will be emailed to you ahead of time.
- During the session, when invited by the Chair, you will share your PPT presentation and deliver your presentation FROM YOUR OWN COMPUTER. *(Please note that we require that you share your Powerpoint presentation with us by Wednesday 7 October via the form above, so we have a copy of your talk in case of technical glitches.)*
- A timer will be used to ensure that all speakers get their 10 minute time frame. Notification will be given 30 seconds before the 8 minutes is up. Anyone not finished within the time allotted will be kindly asked to stop their presentation.
- At the conclusion of your 8 minute presentation, you may be asked questions from the audience via the chat function for up to 2 minutes.
- Judges will be assessing your presentation on a number of criteria for the awarding of prizes.

- We will have approximately 8 participants in each Science Bites session. It is of utmost importance that each person present their talk strictly within the 3 min timeframe: please prepare your slides accordingly, as below.
- Preparing your talk:
 - Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title. The Chair person will use this slide to identify you as the next speaker and call on you to speak.
 - 3 minutes maximum for the presentation with no time for questions
 - PowerPoint – slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing on the Zoom platform.
 - Absolutely no animations.
 - Up to 3 data slides only. The title slide, described above, is extra, for a total of 4 slides.
 - Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
 - No acknowledgement slide is to be presented.
 - You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.

On the day:

- Your presentation will be made via Zoom Webinar. A link to the Zoom session will be emailed to you ahead of time.
- Prior to your session the Organising Committee will compile your talk into a master file of Science Bites presentations for each session.
- During the session, the Chair will move forward your presentation, slide by slide, as you indicate by verbal or visual clue, such as speaking out loud the words 'next slide.' *This will allow a smooth transition between presentations in a short period of time and is the reason we require your talk submitted ahead of time via the form above.*

- A timer will be used to ensure that all speakers get their 3 minute time frame. Notification will be given 20 seconds before the 3 minutes is up. Anyone not finished within the time allotted will be kindly asked to stop their presentation.
- Questions will not be asked during Science Bites sessions. Anyone with questions will be given the chance to ask them via our online networking platform (likely Slack), or by follow-up email.
- Judges will be assessing your presentation on a number of criteria for the awarding of prizes.

If, for exceptional circumstances, you are unable to attend one of these sessions, please alert us by **Friday 25 September** with as much detail as you are comfortable sharing and we will do our best to schedule you accordingly.

By Wednesday 7 October 5pm:

Preparing your E-poster and brief talk:

- We will have approximately 20 participants in each E-poster session. It is of utmost importance that each person present their poster strictly within the 3 min timeframe: please prepare your slide accordingly, as below.
- Preparing your E-poster (electronic poster):
 - Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title. The Chair person may use this slide to identify you as the next speaker and call on you to speak.
 - PowerPoint – slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing on the Zoom platform.
 - 1 data slide only. The title slide, described above, is extra, for a total of 2 slides.
 - Absolutely no animations.
 - Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
 - Poster presenters should prepare a 1-2 minute spiel to go your E-poster, as you would do to present a hard-copy poster.
 - You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly
 - 3 minutes maximum for the presentation with no time for questions

On the day:

- Your presentation will be made via Zoom Meeting. A link to the Zoom session will be emailed to you ahead of time.
- Prior to your session the Organising Committee will compile your talk into a master file of E-poster presentations for each session.
- In your electronic poster session, you will be accompanied by approximately 20 other E-poster presenters, a Chair person and judges for the posters.

- During the session, the Chair will move forward through each single-slide presentation. *This will allow a smooth transition between presentations in a short period of time and is the reason we require your E-poster submitted ahead of time via the form above.*
- A timer will be used to ensure that all speakers get their 3 minute time frame. Notification will be given 20 seconds before the 3 minutes is up. Anyone not finished within the time allotted will be kindly asked to stop their presentation.
- Questions may be asked at the conclusion of all E-poster presentations while judges confer on scores. In addition, anyone with questions will be given the chance to ask them via our online networking platform (likely Slack), or by follow-up email.
- Judges will be assessing your presentation on a number of criteria for the awarding of prizes.
